

















Single branding- Interreg






What about NEXT?

What about the names of programmes?

Black Sea Basin:


«The brand is known, it drives confidence and performance. It has been used throughout two programming cycles, could it be kept for a third one?»



• Poland-Russia:

«We suggest to add the programme name under Interreg, like today for Poland-Saksony. There is no necessity to create a different logo, but adding the name of the programme is crucial»







What about **partner countries** contributing up to 50% of the funding: <u>Will they by acknowledged?</u>

• Karelia:

«We suggest one single logo with EU + Finland + Russia»

• South-East Finland-Russia:

«We suggest to use national flags, but outside the single branding to ensure equal visibility to programme financiers»



• Estonia-Russia:

«We suggest the use of national flags beside the EU flags + a statement about the national cofinancing, to ensure equal treatment for all donors»

• Kolarctic:

«We suggest to combine national symbols of non-member States with Interreg branding»



• Karelia:

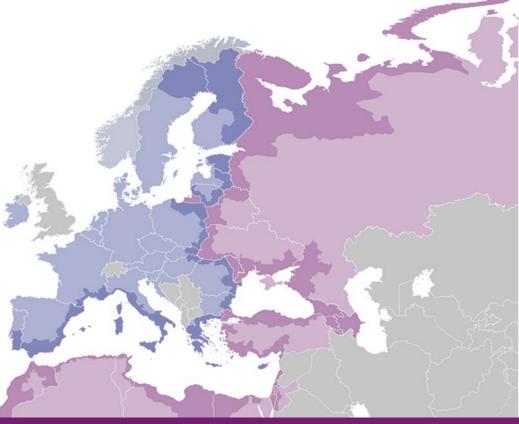
((The worst-case scenario is that we would have separate instructions and requirements from both the European Union and Russia. So far, we have been able to sufficiently please all the parties in the programme branding".

• Estonia-Russia:

((To ensure proper compliance by beneficiaries with the visibility requirements, it would be preferable to have **one single comprehensive logo** for future programmes based on all these details and existing practices".
