The Carpathian Bee is one of its kind, it can only be found on the Carpathian Mountains and it is considered part of the local natural heritage, worth to be protected along with beekeeping traditions. To achieve this, the CarpathianBee project partners have carried out a number of activities, from scientific and monitoring expeditions to high-altitude apiaries, to the installation of nucleus beehives and queen rearing systems with the objective to involve more beekeepers. On the other hand, five new tourist trails have been created on both sides of the border to connect the main beekeeping locations and make them more accessible to visitors. Finally, workshops on beeswax candle making and a Carpathian Honey Festival are going to be organised. All this with the goal of promoting beekeeping traditions and drawing attention among citizens on the need to preserve this unique natural heritage.
