Przemyski Powiat in Poland and Staryi Sambir Raion in Ukraine are the neighbouring regions on different side of the border. The local communities share joint cultural heritage – such as Kalwaria Paclawska village (called Jerusalem of the East) in Poland or the St. Onuphrius Monastery in Lavriv (Ukraine). One of the common challenges for both is to shorten the travel time between them, avoiding the use of border crossings in Medyka–Shehyni or Krościenko–Smilnytsia. In the context of building the new border-crossing point "Malhowice-Nyzhankovychi" between the two regions, the PaNTHer project has developed 12.5 km of border roads in Przemyski Powiat and the local road and streets in Nyzhankovychi village. The partners renewed the road topping and profiles, created a new drainage system, new pavements and bus parking bay and improved pedestrian traffic applying energy and resource-saving technologies. The investment creates conditions for a better mobility and a better access to natural sites, historic and religious heritage of the border regions.
