The project’s aim is to restore the historical “SaltRoad” - an ancient route covering the territory of Zakarpatska oblast (Ukraine) and Szabolcs-Szatmár-Bereg (Hungary). In the XI-XII centuries it was used to transport salt from the Ukrainian city of Solotvyno to Europe. The project helps to save this historical heritage, common to both regions, also by promoting a new touristic route. The reconstructed old road and a new pedestrian path (plus a parking zone in Khust), facilitate the access to the Khust castle. Also, 10 mini-sculptures of castles placed next to the historical monuments (5 in Zakarpatska oblast and 5 in Szabolcs-Szatmár-Bereg) mark the new and the existing routes and make them more attractive to both domestic and foreign tourists.
