SOUTH-EAST FINLAND - RUSSIA



The oldest Finland's canals are military ones and can be found in southern Saimaa: they were built by Alexander Suvorov in the 1790s to protect Russia's western border against Sweden. The history of the four military canals - Kutvele, Käyhkää, Kukonharju and Telataipale - as well as the Russian general himself are not very well known in Finland. The Suvorov project raises awareness on the cross-border sites and fortifications related to Suvorov and creates a unified cultural-historical "Suvorov route" from Russia through Finland to Central Europe. The Russian partners are bringing both Suvorov-related expertise and new destinations to the project. The main activities include the creation of common product and services, small-scale investments into the site-facilities, marketing, and planning of further route development. The long-term objective of the project is to integrate the Suvorov route into one of the Council of Europe's cultural routes.
