Floods, fires and extreme weather conditions are common risks in the project area. The CODE VDIC project seeks to develop a trans-border protocol for civil volunteer organisations to prevent, manage and monitor calamities provoked by man-made and natural disasters. The project partners have set up the Carpathian Region Disaster Response and Mitigation Network, to strengthen cross-border capacities and raise awareness of the importance of preparedness and personal responsibility. The project has organised trainings of trainers, exchanges of good practices and public information campaigns for young people, the elderly and vulnerable citizens to inform and prepare them to act in case of emergencies. The project partners have also developed a joint methodology at macroregional level by using different risk assessment techniques and agreeing on common procedures and good practices. All in all, the network improves the capacity of reaction and provides the possibility to cooperate in case of unforeseen events that require common cross-border action.
