The Transcarpathian villages of Hyzha (Ukraine) and Tarna Mare (Romania) once were one village, now separated by the border. An international checkpoint functioned on the bridge over the Tisza River, between the two villages, but in 2005 it was destroyed by a flooding. Lack of communication suspended the work of the checkpoint, and from that time the villagers from both sides had to cover long distances to meet each other. The DEMOINROUA project stepped in to restore the necessary border infrastructure. The renewal of the road between these two villages is the first large step to restore the border communication which helps to revive economic and tourist life in the cross-border region. Nearly 3 km of roads were renewed and built anew both on the Ukrainian and Romanian sides. Together with the infrastructure improvements, the partners work on strengthening cooperation between the institutions and attracting investments to the common region.
