Winegrowing and winemaking traditions of the Carpathians date back nearly one thousand years, making up an essential part of the local cultural heritage. Nevertheless, they are still not well-known to the general public. The Wine Academy project team wants to reveal the secrets of Carpathian wines by both preserving and promoting local wine traditions. The project focuses on two main wine regions: Zakarpattya (UA) and Podkarpackie (PL). Within the first part of the project – implemented within the Poland – Belarus – Ukraine ENI CBC programme – a thorough research was done to explore the different authentic grape varieties, types of wines and winemaking traditions. The research led to the production of different deliverables, among which the « Carpathian wine list » and the « Wine route map » both available on the Wine Academy project and the ENI CBC PBU Programme websites. In addition, two r additional important activities fall within the scope of the project: a wine festival, which was held in Vynohradiv (UA), and an educational event organised in Podkarpackie Voivodeship (PL).
