Waste collection, disposal and recycling represent an issue of concern for the cross-border regions between Hungary and Ukraine, especially in the mountain and river basin areas as being the source of soil and ground water pollution. The Zero Waste project introduces a comprehensive approach in waste management, focusing on the establishment of waste management facilities and on awareness raising activities within the local communities of Hungary and Ukraine. The infra-structural component includes the construction of a waste sorting complex with a landfill in Yanoshi village (UA), the purchase of equipment for selective waste collection, and the creation of a network of solid waste collection points. The introduction of a selective garbage collection system in the Ukrainian villages of the Berehiv district, the sorting of solid waste and the composting of organic waste from households, are expected to reduce by 50% waste disposal in the area.
