The project tackles significant pollution issues that threaten vital wetlands in the Black Sea Basin (BSB), aiming to preserve these unique ecosystems' biodiversity. Six partners from five countries, including public institutions, environmental NGOs, and national park bodies, collaborate to address these challenges. They focus on raising awareness among local communities and tourists about the harmful impacts on the environment, of everyday activities such as illegal dumping, abandoned fishing nets, excessive plastic use, and unregulated disposal of agricultural and chemical waste. Among project activities are public awareness campaigns to foster responsible behavior, and clean-up initiatives in targeted areas. A network of 10 activity centers, including one mobile unit, forms a transboundary system to combat river-borne and marine litter. The project covers significant wetlands like the Danube Biosphere Reserve and Pomorie Wetland Complex, with a vision to empower society to protect these crucial ecosystems.
