ENSERES is a project aiming to turn things around by using a more holistic approach to protect coastal areas. Partners collaborate with governments, businesses, universities and community groups to build knowledge, create sustainable practices and raise awareness to help manage coastal areas in Lebanon, and Tunisia. Thanks to an exchange of good practices and common methodologies, the project has supported the development of eco-friendly tourism activities and successful pilot projects such as beach cleaning campaigns on Tyre Coast Nature Reserve (LB), areas which are regularly visited by turtles for nesting. By restoring the environment, the project wants to boost responsible tourism, economic resilience and finally to encourage others to adopt similar approaches.
