these and many other digital tools were deployed by the iHERITAGE project to enrich the visitor's cultural experience at some of the important UNESCO World Heritage Sites in the Mediterranean, such as the Arab-Norman Palermo and the Cathedral Churches of Cefalù and Monreale (Italy), the Pyramids of Giza in Egypt, Petra in Jordan, Byblos in Lebanon, and Alhambra in Spain. The partners also created the first Register of Intangible Cultural Heritage of the Mediterranean countries (the REIM) which includes over 260 items from the six participating countries. Furthermore, the digital embrace was extended to promote Mediterranean culinary traditions: the developed augmented and immersive reality applications showcase products fundamental to the Mediterranean Diet, particularly, those produced in Sicily (Italy) and Portugal. The new innovation-driven solutions facilitated cross-border technological transfer, industry-academia collaboration and the creation of spin-offs and new products.
