ProFOLK is a vibrant initiative dedicated to safeguarding Kurpish and Volyn crafts and folklore for generations to come. Through collaborative efforts centered around cultural and historical heritage, the project showcases the rich tapestry of traditions in both regions. The highlight is the “Vanishing Professions” Festival, held in Myszyniec, Poland, and Lutsk, Ukraine, where participants immerse themselves in ethnographic workshops and bilateral exchanges to learn age-old skills like dancing, singing, arts, crafts, and folk music. Notably, the project has compiled these treasures into a CD, which will be distributed to schools, libraries, and cultural institutions on both sides of the border. By enhancing tourism offerings and raising awareness of Kurpish and Volyn folklore, ProFOLK fosters integration and lays the groundwork for future cooperation between these communities.
